More than 247 million COVID-19 vaccines have been administered in the United States, with millions more rolling out. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, (CDC) if you're fully vaccinated and have waited two weeks for your body to build immunity, there are certain activities you can resume with caution:

- Walk, run, wheelchair roll, or bike outdoors with members of your household
- Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people
- Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households
- Attend an outdoor event, like a live performance, parade, or sports event (with a mask.)

At least 24 hours prior to returning to a FirstEnergy work location, all employees who travel internationally or domestically outside of their home state are required to complete the **Employee Return from Travel** form found on [Safe Workplace](#). There are three health questions to answer and submit before returning to a FirstEnergy work location. Employees working from home who answer *yes* to any question on the **Return from Travel** form should not report to company facility or attend an in-person meeting with other employees until medically cleared but may continue working from home.
